Location: Two locations: 1st and Pike, SW corner; and 1st and Stewart, NW corner.

Description: Cast iron manhole cover representing a relief map and listings of popular Seattle locations. Small icons show the locations of each landmark. Artist created eighteen of these manhole covers commissioned by the City of Seattle's 1% for the Art program.

Title: Self-Watering Vertical Planter, circa 1999

Location: Northeast corner of Post Alley at Virginia Street
